THIS IS MY ONE BROKEN PRIZE

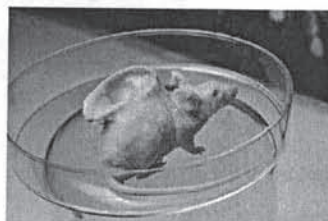
Lyric from the song Isolation by the band Joy Division from the album closer.

As the result of a mental breakdown american popstar Britney Spears shaved her head bald. She is depicted attacking a paparazzi car.

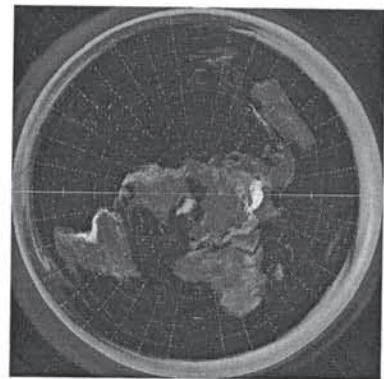

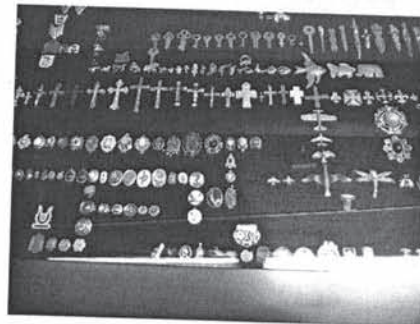
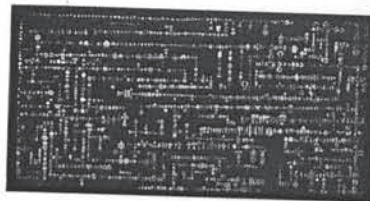

After anonymous accusations, he admitted to the media that he had paid a male prostitute to engage in sex with him for three years and had also purchased and crystal meth. Two days later, New Life Church's Board excommunicated Pastor Ted. The Haggard family moved to Phoenix, Arizona to start the restoration process. Ted wanted his wife to divorce him after the scandal, saying that he thought he had become toxic. Ted is now selling life insurance and sees himself as a heterosexual with complications. He is no longer welcome in his own church.

Blade Runner, a 1982 American science fiction film, depicts a dystopian Los Angeles in November 2019 in which genetically engineered beings called replicants—visually indistinguishable from adult humans—are hunted down and retired by police officer Rick Deckard known as blade runners. In the original movie a origami unicorn is used as callsign of the replicants, because a dream about unicorns is one of their standard memory implants. If the unicorn dream that Deckard has, seen in the slightly different Director's Cut, reveals Deckard as a replicant in the film's end, then the audience's expectations and prejudices are questioned — and, by extension, our humanity. At the time of the original release, this dream sequence raised concerns from studio execs that it would make the film too artsy or abstruse for mainstream audiences, and so it was left on the cutting room floor.

The hand gesture for Time out in English has the same meaning as Check Please in Japanese.



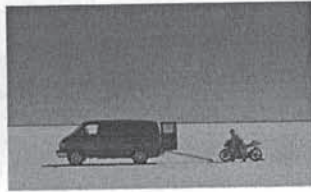

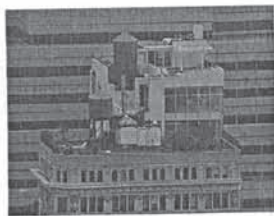

The Brown Bunny is a 2004 American art house film written, produced and directed by actor Vincent Gallo about a motorcycle racer on a cross-country drive who is haunted by memories of his former lover. In the depicted scene Gallo unloads his motorcycle at a dried up salt lake and drives until he becomes invisible at the horizon. The opening scene of Gallo driving was originally almost 20 minutes of him just driving until it was cut down because it was too long. For many critics, it is the worst film ever admitted into the competition of the Cannes film festival. Gallo later apologized for the film and was quoted as saying "I accept what they say. It's a disaster and a waste of time." He apologized to his backers too. "It was never my intention to make a pretentious film, a self-indulgent film, a useless film, an unengaging film."

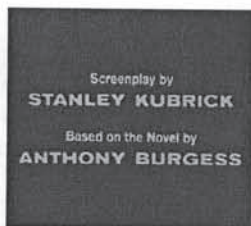
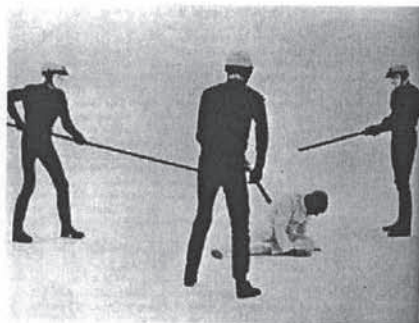
Crescent Lake in China's Gobi Desert sits on the edge of an ancient city that once saw traders embark on their journey along the Silk Road to the West. Today it is drying up and has dropped more than 25 feet in the last 30 years, in part due to water being redirected for local farmers and a doubling of population, resulting in the slow disappearance of a lake that has existed for thousands of years.



Spirit, mission designation MER-A, is a Mars Exploration Rover Mission. It landed successfully on Mars on January 4, 2004. Following mission completion and aided by cleaning events that resulted in higher power from its solar panels, it went on to function effectively over twenty times longer than NASA planners expected. So far Spirit became stuck in soft soil on Mars, overcame dust storms and a dirty, but unclean-able lens. These problems mimic the problems of a human life, such as rheumatic fever or bad vision. The Spirit mars rover has no off-switch installed. This was done to make sure that the machine would not be turned off by hazard. So Spirit continues its journey in solitude without an end in sight.

Due to his time serving in the British Colonial Office in Malaysia, Burgess thought that the phrase could be used punningly to refer to a mechanically responsive (clockwork) human (orang, Malay for man).



THX 1138 is a 1971 science fiction film directed by George Lucas. It depicts a dystopian future in which a high level of control is exerted upon the populace through omnipresent, faceless, android police officers and mandatory, regulated use of special drugs to suppress emotion, including sexual desire. Main character THX is incarcerated in a white limbo world along with a collection of other prisoners. The white room can be linked to the famous scene in *North by Northwest* where the hapless hero was trapped in a field. There is a feeling of complete exposure and vulnerability in a place with no where to hide.

Zabriskie Point is a 1970 film by Michelangelo Antonioni that depicts some aspects of the U.S. counterculture movement in the late 1960s. It tells the story of an idealistic, free spirited young woman, and an aspiring radical turned fugitive. They meet in the desert, instantly connect, and then part with tragic consequences. The girl's connection to the corporate establishment is severed when she visualizes the home of her corporate lover/boss exploding. Michelangelo Antonioni's original ending was a shot of an airplane sky-writing the phrase Fuck You, America, which was cut by MGM president Louis F. Polk. *Zabriskie point* features a notorious desert orgy scene, in which one hundred people participated. Half of them from Joseph Chaikin's Open Theatre company, and the other half made up of assorted hippies.

Dubbed the Wickedest Man in the World, Alistair Crowley is best known for his seemingly contradictory but esoterically linked Law of Thelema: "Do what thou Wilt shall be the whole of the Law. Love is the law, love under Will". Ordo Templi Orientis (O.T.O.) (Order of the Temple of the East, or the Order of Oriental Templars) adopted the law as its own. Youtube hitwonder *lonelygirl15* had a picture of him as a part of what some describe as a shrine in her bedroom.
